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TKC POLICY FOR CLUB DUTIES & 3000 CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS ALLOCATION

The underlying premise of Club duties is as follows:

SOME DEFINITIONS:

Club: means the Tiger Kart Club Inc. Perth Western Australia

Club duties: means the attendance by a member, or in the case of a Cadet or Junior member, a parent or guardian, at a Club day or Open race meeting conducted by the TKC, at either the Cockburn or Wanneroo tracks, to perform duties, as allocated by the TKC, during a race meeting, and such duties are completed to the satisfaction of the TKC.

Member: means a current financial member of the Tiger Kart Club Inc. Perth Western Australia

TKC: means the Tiger Kart Club Inc. Perth Western Australia

POLICY:

To be eligible to undertake or renew a Tiger Kart Club membership *and* compete at Club Day and/or Open race meetings conducted by the Club, it is compulsory that Club Duties and/or tasks, as may be requested by the Club from time to time, to be undertaken as part of such membership.

Race meetings can only be conducted if sufficient Club members attend and complete their duties. In the event that insufficient members (a minimum of 10, and maximum of 15 are required) attend to complete their Club duties at a race meeting, the meeting may be cancelled by the Committee.

The Club administrator will, prior to the race meeting, inform (once, via email only) those members that have been registered for Club duties at the next Club day or Open race meeting. The Club administrator will not make any further attempts, via phone or any other means, to confirm a member's attendance.

It is the member's responsibility to ensure that they either attend their designated race meeting to perform Club duties, or make arrangements with another Club member to be their replacement (Club duties points will only be allocated to the attending member).

1. Members who have requested to complete duties at any race meeting will only receive points if that meeting goes ahead.
2. All race meetings conducted by the Tiger Kart Club between 1st February and 30th November, will be eligible for Club duties and Championship Points.
3. The 'Have A Go' meeting held in December will be eligible for members to complete their Club duties and receive Club Championship points toward the following year (eg. Points for doing Club duties at the 2018 Have A Go will be applied to the 2019 championship year, and so on.)

4. The 'Fun Day' meeting held in January will be staffed by Committee members, but if there is a requirement to supplement Club duties positions by Club members, then this race meeting may become available, at the discretion of the Committee, for some members to complete their Club duties and receive their Club duties points for doing so.
5. One less than the total number of Club Day meetings run between February and November inclusive, will count towards overall Club Championship points (eg. If 10 Club days are run, only 9 of those will count toward the Club Championship. If 9 Club days are run, only 8 of those will count toward Club Championship, and so on.) In all cases where a member has raced at all available Club days for the year, a round must be dropped for the calculation of final championship points. The round dropped will be the one with the lowest points.
6. Parents or guardians of Cadet and Junior drivers will be required to perform Club duties on behalf of their children for Club Championship points to be allocated. Parents or guardians only need to complete one (1) set of Club duties for all children they have racing. If the parent or guardian is a TKC member, they may also complete their own Club duties at the same time.
7. All racing members will be provided 3000 Club Championship points for undertaking their Club duties, – irrespective of the role undertaken (e.g. no difference between a Steward or a trolley person).
8. Any member or, in the case of a Cadet or Junior member, a parent or guardian, not having completed Club duties before 30th November of the Club championship year will not be eligible for the Club championship.
9. Tiger Kart Club reserve the right to refuse race entries for future race meetings at TKC, for any members who have not undertaken their Club duties, irrespective of them having joined another club. **(As voted by club members attending the 2015 Annual General Meeting)**
10. Members/Families (being cadet, junior, or senior members) who have volunteered to be on the annual Cockburn Practice Officials Roster, will be eligible to receive their 3000 Club duties points toward their Club Championship, by their running of four (4) Saturday afternoon practice sessions at the Cockburn track, on or before 30th November each year. **(As voted by club members attending the 2016 Annual General Meeting)**
11. A member must compete at a minimum of three (3) TKC Club days, as well as complete their TKC Club duties and/or tasks, to be eligible for the TKC Club Championship. A member who competes in more than one racing class, at TKC Club day race meetings, during the Club Championship year, must compete at a minimum of three (3) TKC Club days in a class, to be eligible to receive their 3000 Club Championship points for that racing class. A member or, in the case of a Cadet or Junior member, a parent or guardian, need only complete one (1) set of Club duties/tasks to receive 3000 Club duties points for multiple racing classes. A member may commence or cease racing in any particular TKC Club day class at any time during the Club Championship year.

This Policy document is provided for member's general information as to how the Club endeavors to ensure that planned race days, and in particular Club days, can proceed with YOUR help.

Members of the Executive Committee may consider alternative arrangements for a member in exceptional circumstances only upon written application by the member.
